Cross-cultural points of contact between Eastern and Central European countries and Scandinavian countries in literature, culture and arts.

(5 ECTS credits)

Content: The course gives students insight into the points of contact between Eastern/Central European countries (Poland, Lithuania, Serbia, Czech Republic) and Scandinavia (Norway, Denmark, Sweden) in history, art, and culture. The lectures will include: Representations of the Balkans in Scandinavian film and culture, The cross-historical and cultural points between Norway and Poland since 10th century A.D. till nowadays, H.C. Andersen's "En Digters Bazar" - travel description of the Balkans, Language planning and nation-building in Scandinavia, the Baltics and the Balkans: possibilities for comparative research, Footprints of the North in Bohemia. Students will be cooperating in multinational teams choosing one of the possible project fields, i.e. literature, history, arts, pop culture and making a research into the common elements and influences between their respective countries and Scandinavian countries (students can choose one or more Scandinavian countries). As a result of their cooperation they will prepare a multimedia presentation to share with all the course participants. The language of the course/ project is English.

The most important learning outcomes are:

- Increased awareness of the shared cultural heritage and historical connections between Eastern/Central European countries and Scandinavia.
- Collaborative skills developed in team-based activities. By working together, participants will enhance their understanding of cross-cultural dynamics and cooperation.
- Analytical thinking students will apply critical thinking skills by analysing various text, artistic expressions when looking for the common points between cultures.
- Research and presentation skills at the end of the course, all the groups will present their findings in a form of a multimedia presentation.
